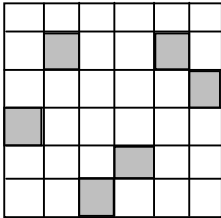

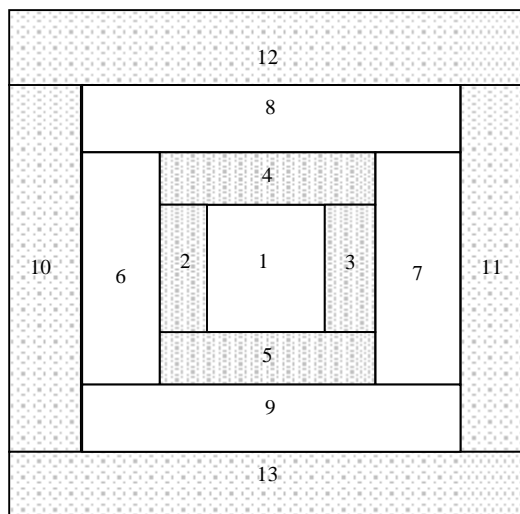


BOM 2

Court-House-Steps



A3.B2.C6.D5.E2.F3



Cut:

Fabric parts	Cutting dimensions	Type of fabric
1 centre square (no. 1)	9.5 x 9.5cm	With embroidery
2 strips (no. 2, no. 3)	6.0 x 9.5cm	Blue-white
2 strips (no. 4, no. 5)	6.0 x 18.5cm	Blue-white
2 strips (no. 6, no. 7)	8.5 x 18.5cm	White
2 strips (no. 8, no. 9)	8.5 x 32.5cm	White
2 strips (no. 10, no. 11)	5.5 x 32.5cm	Blue-white
2 strips (no. 12, no. 13)	5.5 x 40.5cm	Blue-white

Sewing:

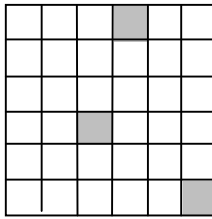
Sew strips no. 2 and no. 3 onto the right and left of the centre square. Sew strips no. 4 and no. 5 onto the top and bottom of the centre square. Sew the other strips as shown in the diagram.

Tip

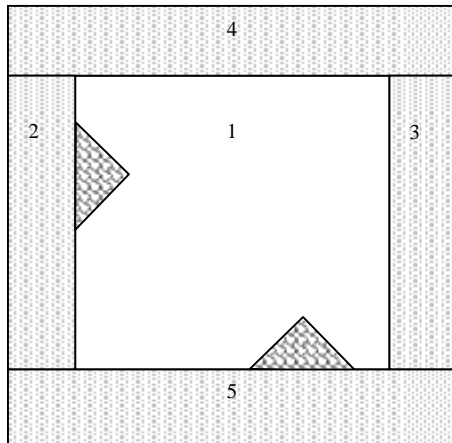
You can change the width of the strips as you wish.

Careful: you will then have to recalculate the length of the strips!

Court-House-Steps with Triangle



C4, D1, F6 (without triangle)



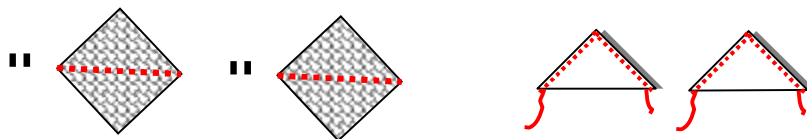
Cut:

Fabric parts	Cutting dimensions	Type of fabric
1 centre square (no. 1)	30.5 x 30.5cm	With embroidery
2 strips (no. 2, no. 3)	6.5 x 30.5cm	Blue-white
2 strips (no. 4, no. 5)	6.5 x 40.5cm	Blue-white
2 squares	11.0 x 11.0cm	Made from white-blue, patterned fabric

Sewing:

1st Step

Divide both squares in half diagonally to create a total of four triangles.



Put each pair of triangles on top of each other right to right and sew together along both short edges. Then turn the triangles using the open sides.

2nd Step

Sew strip no. 2 to the centre square, sewing in one of the triangles by its open edge. Sew strips no. 3 and no. 4 without the triangle and strip no. 5 with the triangle around the centre square, following the diagram.

3rd Step

Make a few stitches by hand to fix the loose points of the triangle.
