

## BOM 1



### Pin cushion and dressmaker's dummy

#### **Size (a - d):**

Finished block size

20 x 58 cm

Block size including seam allowance

21.5 x 59.5 cm



**Cut:**

**1a**

Fabric G (beige with beige roses) 13.5 x 11.5 cm

**1b**

Pink plaid/gingham fabric 9.5 x 11.5 cm

**1c**

Fabric L (white with little roses) 21.5 x 43.5 cm

**1d**

Fabric G (grey plaid/gingham) 21.5 x 7.5 cm

(Cut the fabric on the bias, so that the check runs on the bias)

### Preparation:

It will make it easier to work accurately, if you cut out the fabrics for the background somewhat larger than the finished size of the block. This makes it easier to embroider and appliqué. If you use an embroidery frame, you must cut the fabric large enough to be stretched over the whole frame. Sketch the outline of the block on to the cutting line with a water soluble pen. This will help you when you position the appliqué motif.

After finishing the embroidery and appliqué moisten the outlines made by the marking pen with a damp cloth. Iron the block and cut to the required length.

This method applies to all the other blocks for the quilt, on which embroidery or appliqué is worked.

### Selection of fabrics:

#### 1a Pin cushion

Top	Fabric L (white with little roses)
Base	Fabric remnant in burgundy
Band round middle	Fabric remnant in dark burgundy

#### 1b Dressmaker's dummy

Upper part and foot	Fabric remnant in burgundy
Stand	Fabric remnant in dark brown
Body	Fabric H (beige plaid/gingham)

### Instructions:

For the dressmaker's dummy sew the two pieces of fabrics L and G to each other. Attach the dressmaker's dummy and the pincushion using the needle turn method with **Totally Stable**.

Sew lace by hand parallel to the hem and around the neckline.

### Embroidery:

On the pincushion embroider the lettering "Pins" in backstitch using **Cotton 12** in anthracite; embroider the heads of the pins and the lines across the cushion and the cushion outline in the same way. Embroider the pins in backstitch in beige.

### Finishing:

Sew blocks 1a and 1b together.

Sew a piece of lace over the seam.

Sew both blocks to Block1c/d.
